Diocesan Safe Ministry Action Plan

The Safe Ministry Reference Group (SMRG), Safe Ministry and Inclusion Officer and Registry Team are continuing to develop this Action Plan to meet the new Child Safe Standards. This Action Plan will include diocesan responsibilities as well as parish requirements.
