Safe Ministry Training

It is terrific to see the continued participation with the Safe Ministry Training. As ministries and programs commence again for the year, please remember to ensure all clergy, staff and volunteers have completed or are in process of completing their required training.

As you will remember, in September 2022 our training provider changed platforms for levels 1 and 2 of our Safe Ministry training. To access the online training modules please follow the links on the <u>training</u> <u>page</u> of the Safe Ministry Toolbox. Old links will longer work and you will get an error message.

With this new platform for training, parishes are now able to have their own group analyst for the online training modules. This allows the parish to see who has completed levels 1 and 2 of training. This person can be the Vicar or the Child Safe Officer. Please email etraining@safercommunities.net.au (cc: safeministry@melbourneaglican.org.au) to organise this.

There are 3 ways to access this Level 1 and 2 training for volunteers. These include:

- Accessing the online training through the diocesan training page on the Safe Ministry Toolbox.
- Parish facilitated small groups using the online modules. The resources for running these groups can also be found on the <u>training page</u>.
- A diocesan trainer may be able to run face to face training by request to the diocese.

All Clergy and authorised ministers are required to complete Level 1 and 2 training using the online platform.

Level 3 training is available through Zoom sessions - the link for booking into these is also on the training page.

For parishes and congregations who have used the facilitated small groups, we hope you have found this a helpful way to training people in your parish. To keep reliable records of this method of training, we are asking you to please use the parish facilatated group training register (on the <u>training page</u> of the Safe Ministry Toolbox) to list all participants and email it to

<u>safeministry@melbourneangllican.org.au</u>. We ask that this be sent to the diocese as soon as possible.

Volunteer and Lay Employee Registers

It is a requirement under the Child Safe Standards that organisations record all screening, clearance and training information for volunteers and staff. This means that each parish is required to record this information on the parish Volunteer and Lay Employee Register. The Registry team has been working through these registers with parishes to ensure the correct information is recorded. Parishes were requested to email their Register to registrar@melbourneanglican.org.au in March 2022. The Register is a living document and needs to be continually maintained.

For parishes who use a digital data base (eg. Elvanto) to record this information, please ensure a report with fields matching the register can be emailed to the Registrar when requested.

Diocesan Safe Ministry Action Plan

The Safe Ministry Reference Group (SMRG) is in the final drafting and approval stage of this Action Plan. Once the action plan final draft is approved by Archbishop in Council, it will be rolled out across our diocese.

Parishes are encouraged to continue using the diocesan <u>Child Safe Standards self-assessment tool</u> found on the <u>Child Safe Standards webpage</u> of the Safe Ministry Toolbox to monitor how they are putting the Standards into action.

Updates to Safe Ministry and Child Safety & Wellbeing Policies and Procedures

Following the introduction of the new Child Safe Standards, the diocese is in the process of updating its Safe Ministry and Child Safety & Wellbeing Policies and Procedures. We are continuing to work with the 30 representative parishes in the development of these updates. Further communication about these documents will happen as the process continues.
