Diocesan Action Plan for Meeting the Victorian Child Safe Standards and Information Session

The Diocesan Action Plan for Meeting the 11 Victorian Child Safe Standards and the Parish Self-Assessment template are both on the Toolbox.

We have developed new Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs), following the Information Session which are also available on the Child Safe Standards page of the Toolbox.

Safe Ministry and Child Safety & Wellbeing Policies and **Procedures**

The new and updated Safe Ministry and Child Safety & Wellbeing Policies and Procedures are available in the <u>Document Library</u> on the Toolbox. These policies and procedures now have a QR code on the front page so the Document Library can be accessed digitally. One of these new policies is a Child Safety Policy that is written for children and youth. We are working on translations, and this may take some time, so your patience is appreciated.

As the Statement for Commitment has been combined into the new Code of Conduct for Child Safety and Wellbeing, all clergy, lay staff, and volunteers need to sign this new Code.

Volunteer and Lay Employee Registers

As all Clergy should be aware, parishes and AACs are required to maintain their <u>Volunteer and Lay Employee Register</u>. This

Did you know? Child Safe Standard #7 requires each organisation to have processes for complaints and concerns are child focused.

How does your parish/congregation do this?

The minimum parish actions are:

- policies and procedures are available.
- Parish procedures are consistent with diocesan policies.
- Parish websites link to diocesan website.
- all clergy, staff and volunteers are informed of the reporting and complaints handling procedure.
- The child safe officer contact information is displayed in the parish.
- The role of Kooyoora is highlighted regularly.



Register is an ongoing, living document and tool which is to be kept up to date by each parish as a record of the screen and safe ministry training undertaken by each volunteer/employee. Each parish will have their own administrative processes however the Vicar holds overall responsibility for ensuring that safe ministry requirements are met, including the upkeep of this register.

For parishes who use a digital data base (eg. Elvanto) to record this information, please ensure a report with fields matching the Register can be emailed to the Registrar when requested. The Registry Services team can request this Register be forwarded to the diocese at any time and <u>CCYP</u> may also request these records as part of their compliance activity in ensuring that the Child Safe standards are met.

Safe Ministry Training

A reminder that there are 3 ways to complete training which are explained in the <u>Safe Ministry Training Implementation 2023 flyer</u>. For parishes and congregations who have used the parish facilitated small group option, we hope you have found this a helpful way to training people in your parish. Links to all levels of training are on the training page of the Safe Ministry Toolbox.

Parishes can set up a group analyst to administrate the online training and access records to add to the Volunteer and Lay Employee Register. This can be set up by emailing the etraining team, etraining@safercommunities.net.au, and copy (cc) the safe ministry team, safeministry@melbourneanglican.org.au.

Reporting Child Abuse in the Anglican Diocese of Melbourne

- All suspicions or reports of child abuse must be reported to:

Kooyoora Professional Standards What is Child Abuse?

Abuse and neglect includes but is not limited to:

Physical Abuse, Emotional Abuse, Family Violence, Sexual Abuse, Grooming and Neglect. Who can report neglect and abuse of a child under the age of 18?

Children, Parents, Staff, Volunteers, Anyone. What sorts of things must be reported?

All child safety concerns must be reported:

- Disclosure of past and present abuse and harm
- Allegations, suspicions or observations
- Breaches of the Code of Conduct
