Diocesan Action Plan for Meeting the Victorian Child Safe Standards

Thank you for engaging with this action plan in your parishes and congregations and for your questions as you work through this. The Diocesan Action Plan for Meeting the 11 Victorian Child Safe Standards and the Parish Self-Assessment template are both on the Toolbox and can be found on the Child Safe Standards page of the Safe Ministry Toolbox. There have been several questions about risk management. The Safe Ministry Reference Group is progressing work on the Child Abuse Risk Management Tool aiming to have it available early in 2024. Other OHS risk management information and tools can be found here on the parish portal.

Volunteer and Lay Employee Registers

The <u>Volunteer and Lay Employee Register</u> is an ongoing, living document and tool which is to be kept up to date by each parish and congregation as a record of the screening and safe ministry training undertaken by each volunteer/employee. Each parish will have their own administrative processes however the Vicar holds overall responsibility for ensuring that safe ministry screening and training requirements are met, including the upkeep of this register.

As part of the annual return to be forwarded to Registry Services, a copy of each parish or congregation Register is to be included. Information about what is included in the annual returns can be found https://example.com/here_on-the-Parish Portal_the-Register is part of item 8.

Did you know?
Child Safe Standard #2 requires
child safety and wellbeing to be
embedded in organisational
leadership, governance and
culture.

How does your parish/congregation do this?

The minimum parish actions include:

- Reporting child abuse posters visible in common areas.
- Each Parish appoints a Child Safe officer and notifies the Diocese.
- Child Safety is regularly spoken about as a value by leaders in services.
- Volunteer and Lay Employee Register is kept up to date (as a living document) and returned to Diocese as required.

Adults can support children and young people to tell someone they trust is they have a concern.

Kooyoora Professional Standards What is Child Abuse?

Abuse and neglect includes but is not limited to:

Physical Abuse, Emotional Abuse, Family Violence, Sexual Abuse, Grooming and Neglect. Who can report neglect and abuse of a child under the age of 18?

Children, Parents, Staff, Volunteers, Anyone. What sorts of things must be reported?

All child safety concerns must be reported:

- Disclosure of past and present abuse and harm
- Allegations, suspicions or observations
- Breaches of the Code of Conduct
